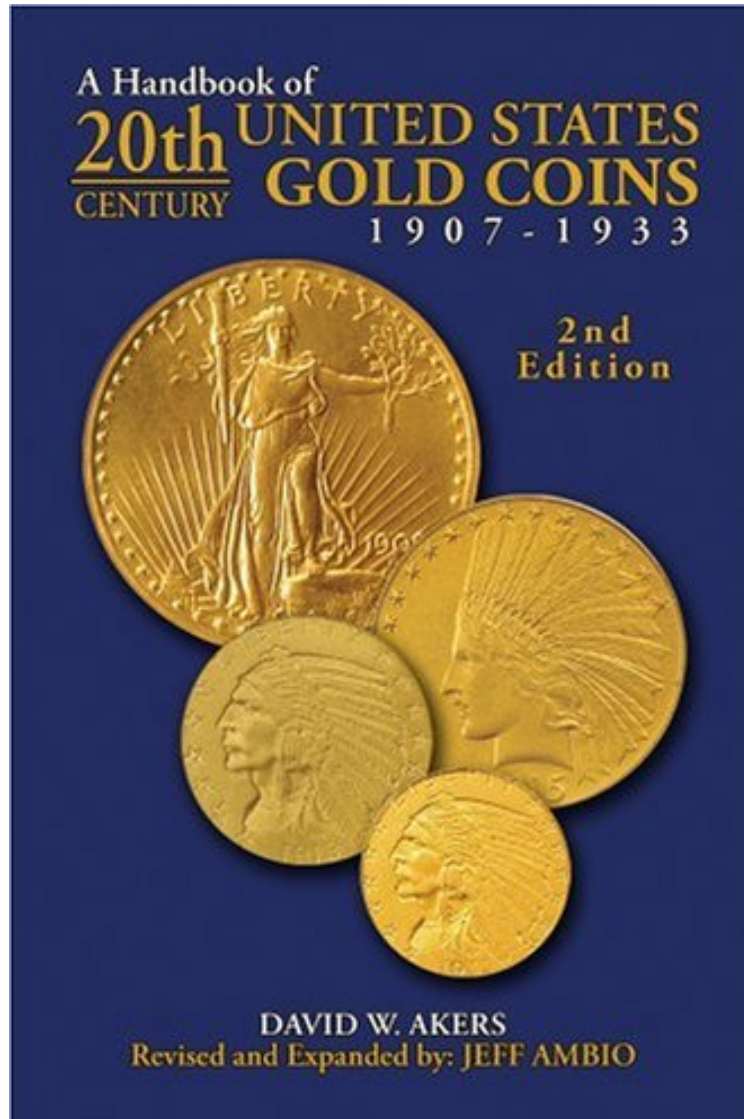

This second edition of David W. Akers' groundbreaking work *A Handbook of 20th-Century United States Gold Coins: 1907-1933* goes well beyond a simple rewriting of Akers' original manuscript. It is also much more than an edit--it is a complete and thorough revision that corrects, updates and expands the information presented in the first edition. The relative rarity rankings of each issue in the various 20th century U.S. gold series have been brought up to date in light of recent discoveries and revised grading standards. Additionally, the analysis of each individual issue is greatly enhanced with far greater attention paid to important characteristics such as strike, luster and color. In-depth analyses of each proof issue in the 20th century U.S. gold series have also been added--something that was completely absent from the first edition. Pedigree listings of some of the more important examples of each issue have also been sorted out and brought up to date. In sum, this revised and expanded edition of *A Handbook of 20th-Century United States Gold Coins* provides the reader with all of the tools they need to buy and sell these special coins in the numismatic market of the 21st century. It is a thoroughly researched, well written and lucid appraisal that has been long overdue.
