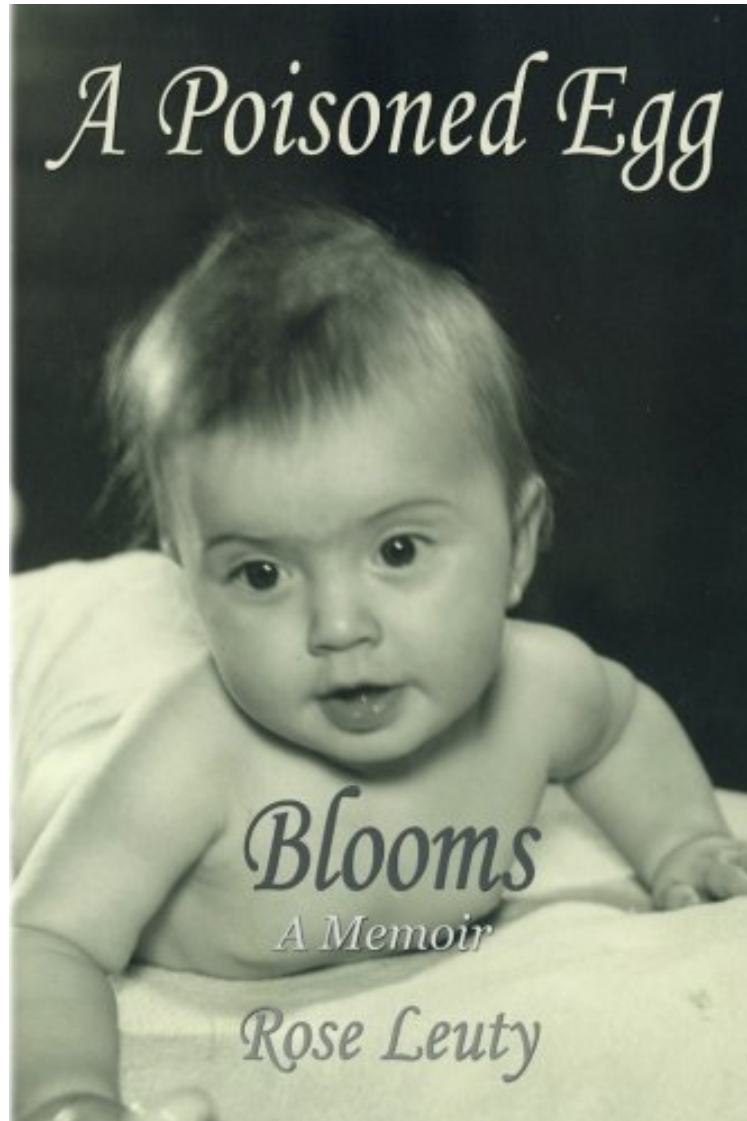

Rose grew up in Southern California where she was repeatedly raped at a nudist colony starting at age nine. It was arranged by her father. Later, her mother, attracted to her rapist, allowed him to rape her daughter in Rose's own bedroom. Rose finally got help at age twelve.Rose

became a teenager and her parents put her in a country boarding school where she met her ideal teen boyfriend. He left her when he found out she was not a virgin. She would go on to confront life with this dark rape cloud over her consciousness. As a young adult in Berkeley, Rose studied dance and performed in front of hundreds of people. After a career hindered by injury, she moved to the California Sierra foothills where she became a firefighter. By blending nature, animals and country life, her finest writing is personified in her clear descriptions of incidents she survived. As a firefighter, Rose and her partner rescued a woman whose car dangled over a cliff, in the mountains, above the local river. Excellent suspense, action and detail. One night, Rose needed a ride from "town" to her country home 20 miles north in the mountains. This was late at night, in the middle of a fierce snow storm. A 70 year old Good Samaritan lady, who had no chains for her car, agreed to help Rose. The narrator (Rose) brings us into this scene as if the readers are sitting in the back seat. We can almost feel the car skidding on the icy pavement down toward the river canyon below. We don't know how we can make it home with Rose, but somehow we do. This book is a refreshing liberation from all those psycho-babble terms that could be applied to this text, like "dysfunctional." The pages have a few pictures of Rose over the years. Anyone can see why she's described as, "slim, ripe and beautiful." Just look at her photo as a dashing firefighter on page 134. There she is as an enticing country girl on page 110. In publishing this independent book, I know how much work it is to polish it up. Rose has a few typos and editing areas to clean up but they all are insignificant. Also, I'd call this a subjective book. The more the reader relates to Rose and her life, the better it is. It speaks to those who need to hear it. If your life is full of peace, love and happiness then you may not be ready to learn from the world of this incredible Rose.
