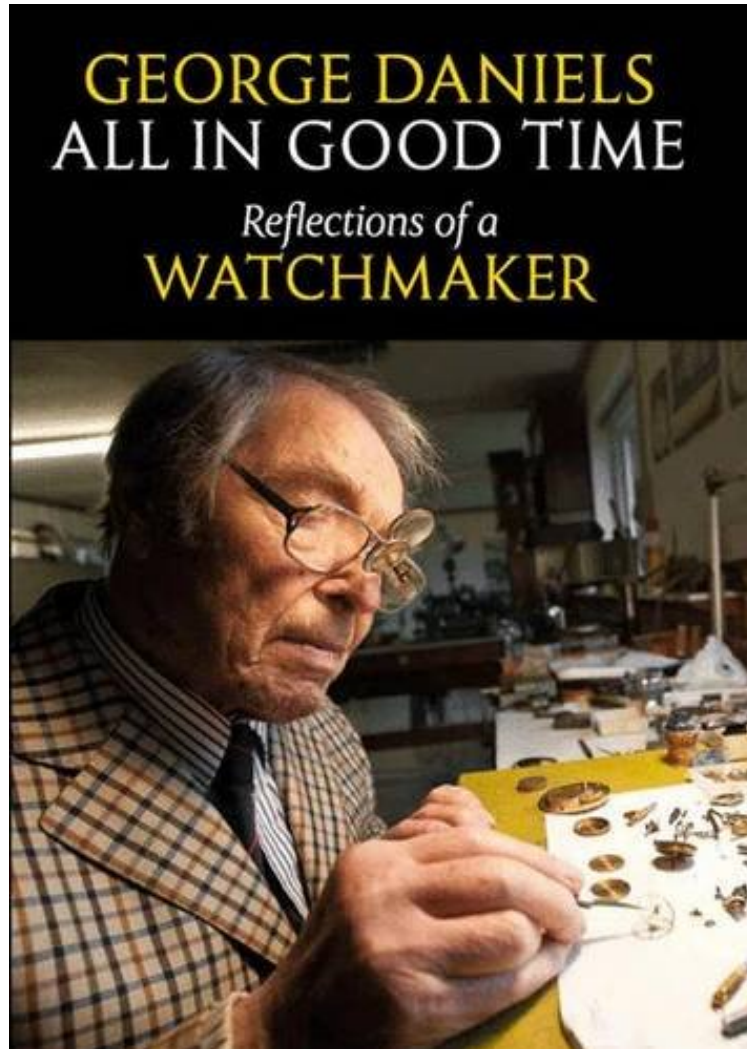

successful struggle to have his new co-axial escapement invention accepted by the Swiss. It is now used in high-end Omega watches.
