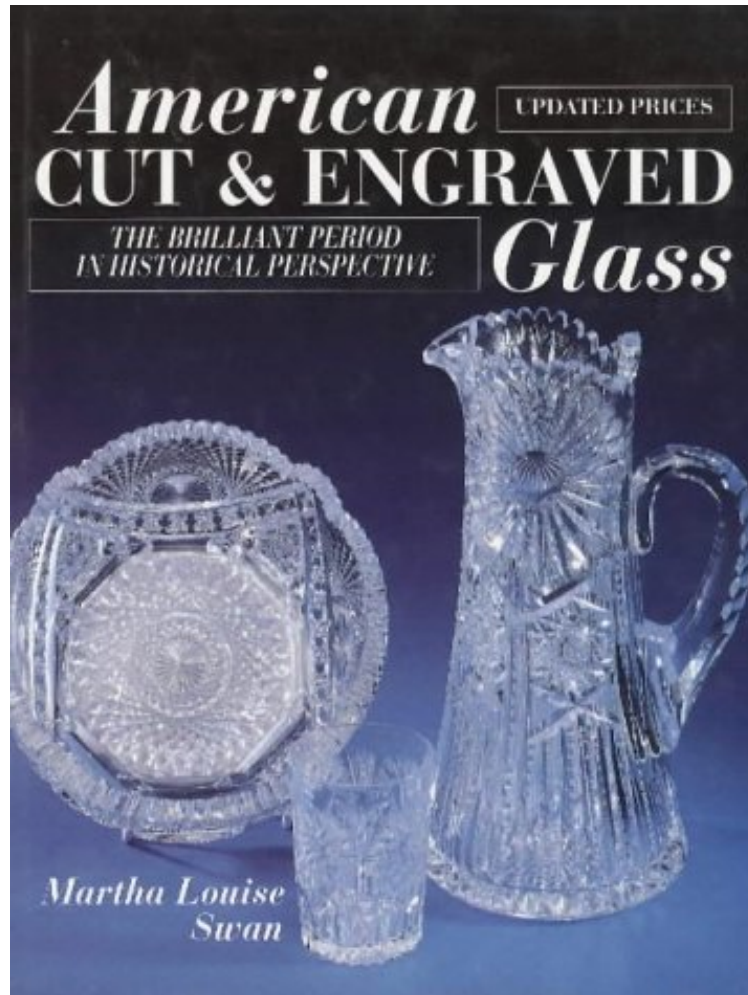


American Cut and Engraved Glass: The Brilliant Period in Historical Perspective
