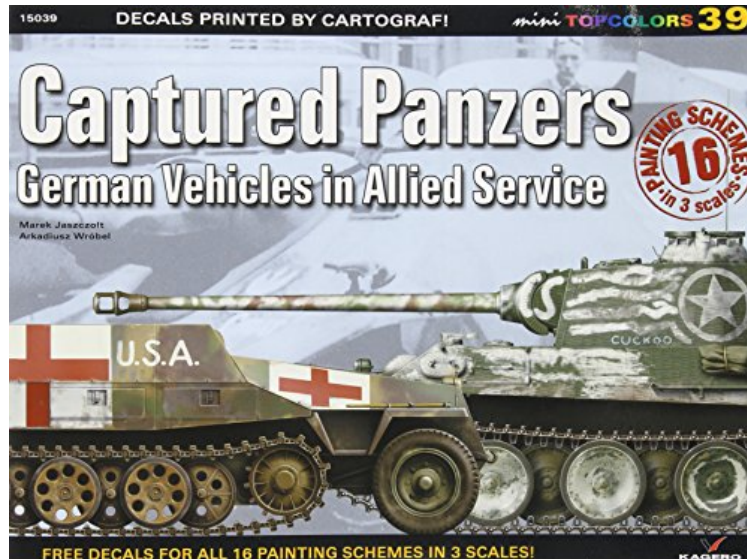

The booklet is about WWII German vehicles captured and used by the Free French, British, Polish Resistance, and US Army during 1942-45. Great profiles and descriptions of 16 captured and repurposed vehicles. All the airbrushed profiles are in approx 1/35 scale or whatever fills the page in this horizontal layout printing. It's by KAGERO, so the quality is there, and in English and Polish languages. Great book for casual or serious historians and interested persons. OUTSTANDING booklet for the plastic modeler in any of the three popular AFV scales because it includes a Cartograf decal sheet that includes the markings for all 16 featured vehicles in each of the three scales. Want to enter something different in a model competition or just have something besides Axis markings in your collection? Here ya go! Hey, I bought it and I don't seriously build any AFV kits. It's that good. Ans does a great job getting it to you in pristine condition!

A big decal sheet with 1:72, 1:48 and 1:35 markings for no less than 16 German armored fighting vehicles captured by Allied troops and used against their former owners. The decal sheet was printed by Cartograf. Each painting scheme is depicted on beautifully drawn color profile and described in the 18 page guidebook with English and Polish text.
